Epilepsy Nurse Specialist

A diagnosis of Epilepsy can cause worry for you, your relatives or carers. The Epilepsy Specialist Nurses can offer support and advice at diagnosis and at any time throughout your treatment.

The Epilepsy Nurse Specialist can advise on all aspects of care for people with Epilepsy and those who are newly diagnosed.

This includes:

- Advice / Support
- Information Living with epilepsy
- Seizure monitoring
- Medication monitoring
- Preconception counselling
- Pregnancy and epilepsy
- Self-management
- Education / Training for families, carers, health care professionals
- Rescue medication plans and training
- Adjustment of Vagal Nerve Stimulator

The Epilepsy Nurse Specialist can meet with patients, relatives and carers in a Nurse led clinic, at home / in the community or on a hospital ward.

How you can access the service

Referrals are taken from patients and carers, Consultant Neurologists, General Practitioners and members of the multidisciplinary team. The Epilepsy Nurses work Monday to Friday 8.30 am to 4.30 pm, excluding bank holidays.
