I'm Dr Chooi Oh, Clinical Director for Radiology at Lancashire Teaching Hospitals. Thank you for your interest in joining us.

Our department has expanded steadily over the last 20 years, and is now the largest and most diverse department of radiology within the region. Our team consists of over 40 radiologists, including over 30 consultants, two speciality doctors and 10 specialist registrars. Our team is our work family. We are a diverse and friendly department, and are fully supportive of career development and flexible working patterns.

We understand the desire of our specialist radiologists to work with the latest equipment, and are committed to a continuous programme of equipment replacement to meet these needs. We currently operate a suite of four CT scanners and five MRI scanners, including 3.0 T, 1.5 T and low field extremity units. We have a new Hybrid Theatre Suite to support our specialist vascular services, a Neuro Interventional Unit, and specialist nuclear medicine units, including a PET CT scanner and a Hybrid CT/Gamma Camera Unit, both recently installed.

We operate in an exciting environment for diagnostic and interventional radiology. We continue to expand, and provide services as a regional hub.


A beacon for foodies, there are bustling local markets, gastropubs, artisan producers and Michelin starred restaurants.

The radiology service

Our department has always embraced a vision of specialist working within a unified team. Each of us has developed speciality skills to support the specialist clinical enterprises required of a large regional teaching hospital, but also retain a team ethos and collegiate atmosphere which is second to none.

We provide regional specialist services in vascular and interventional radiology, diagnostic and interventional neuro radiology, diagnostic and therapeutic nuclear medicine and oncological imaging. Individuals within our team with special interests also support our commitment to trauma imaging and our ground breaking post mortem imaging service. Each of these sup-speciality interests is supported by close multidisciplinary team working with the relevant clinicians, and by specialist equipment. As a newly joined radiologist within our team, you will be encouraged to develop a special interest and work closely with a similarly skilled group of colleagues.

We believe in developing the future of medicine in the UK. We are a major teaching hospital for medical students from the University of Manchester, and there are many educational opportunities available for doctors interested in teaching and education. For those who are keen to be involved in post graduate education, we support a large foundation programme, and are one of the largest specialist training centres for radiology in the region. We also now have a post-graduate higher training position in the PET CT Fellowship. We receive excellent ratings from our trainees, a number of whom have gone on to join us as consultants after qualification.

We believe in supporting each individual in developing their career. We are generous with study leave, and encourage doctors who join us as specialty doctors to take specialist exams and progress towards CCT via article 14 or by joining formal specialist training.

We work closely with a large team of radiographers and nurses, many of whom are supported to develop specialist interests, higher qualifications and extended roles.


We are geographically a large organisation with specialist services delivered at two main sites, Royal Preston Hospital and Chorley District Hospital, with some services delivered at small community hubs locally. We are working with local providers and the Sustainability and Transformation Partnership (STP) to develop our ability to deliver services flexibly across both hospital sites and within the community.

In addition to being the Major Trauma Centre for the whole of Lancashire, we offer many tertiary referral services for the region including cancer management, neuroradiology and interventional radiology. We have many multi-disciplinary network multi-disciplinary teams in areas such as sarcoma, urology and gynaecology.

Our consultants work hard but enjoy the support of all of our team and clinicians throughout the hospitals. Many opportunities exist within our team to take on additional roles, and time for these is recognised within our job planning process. We pride ourselves on the knowledge that all of our specialist clinical teams within the hospital regard "their" radiologists as indispensable!







The radiology team

We work as a large but friendly group of radiologists. Our team consists of over 30 consultant radiologists, two speciality doctors, and more than ten specialist registrars. We are ably supported by nearly 200 radiographers, radiology nurses, and medical secretaries, together with a large and indispensable office team.

Our team members are supported, informally by colleagues and formally by a regular appraisal. Personal development is encouraged, and we strongly support interests in education, teaching, research and professional development.

We are forward looking and committed to research and service development. We have a specialist research facility, which cannot function without the support of our clinical radiologists. Our team have also been recognised within national awards ceremonies. We have strong corporate values within our organisation, which build on both clinical excellence and the traditional regional values of friendliness and individual worth. We have retained and emphasised these values throughout a long period of development, and will seek to put them at the heart of developments in the future too.

Research

We host the National Institute of Health Research (NIHR) Experimental Medicine Clinical Research Facility, which is a dynamic partnership with our local community trust and Lancaster University.

The **facility** has a remit to grow early translational and experimental medicines trials across Lancashire and South Cumbria, and has high quality clinical space, experienced staff, laboratory facilities and overnight accommodation. We also host Brain Tumour North West – a collaborative that supports the collection of brain tumour tissue to inform research into improved treatments and diagnostics in brain cancers, and are developing a bio-resource with a Research HTA licence and growing informatics infrastructure.

As a local delivery partner for the 100K Genomes project, we are at the forefront of the national transformation of genomics services in the NHS. We consistently recruit the most participants to NIHR clinical trials in the region, and have a broad portfolio of multi-centre and locally led research studies. Working closely with academic partners we have a developing cohort of clinical academic fellows working towards MDs and PhDs, and have established joint clinical academic appointments.

Our facility provides the best possible environment in which to host research studies and clinical trials, and our award-winning research team will provide you with a wide range of expert support to undertake research work. Our national research trials include:

PRISM - looking at the use of supplemental breathing masks to optimise patients after open abdominal surgery

The 65 trial - looking at how we control blood pressure in the over 65 year olds

Prevent Harp 2 – looking at the use of statins in reducing respiratory complications in postoperative patients

We have a highly enthusiastic department with two specialist research nurses, an academic foundation year trainee and research clinical fellows.

We have close relationships with UCLAN and Lancaster University for developing projects and we're keen for any new ideas.

Many of our medical staff routinely publish original research papers in peer-reviewed journals. Our staff are also supported in presenting their findings at local or international meetings.

Our staff have also had their work published and shared nationally. This includes the second edition of "A Beginners Guide to Intensive Care Medicine", a shortlisted BMJ Book of the Year, which has many chapters written by our medical staff. Clinical Director, Chooi Oh, is also the primary author of a book entitled "Pocket Tutor Muscoloskeletal Imaging" which provides practical guidance for medical students and foundation doctors.
