## Advice following your procedure

The procedure was carried out under local anaesthetic, the effects of which last approximately 2-3 hours

It is important you follow these instructions for the next 48 hours:

- Have a responsible adult escort you home and supervise you overnight
- For pain/discomfort take Paracetamol (but avoid Aspirin or Ibuprofen) and follow the advice on the medication. If the pain continues for longer than 24 hours please seek medical attention
- Regularly check your abdomen where you had the drain. Some bruising at the site may occur. This is quite normal. If swelling or bleeding occurs, apply immediate pressure directly to the area for 5 to 10 minutes. Call an ambulance and take your discharge letter with you
- Avoid heavy lifting
