Advice following your procedure

The procedure was carried out under local anaesthetic, the effects of which last approximately 2-3 hours. It is important you follow these instructions for the next 48 hours:

- Have a responsible adult escort you home and supervise you overnight (you must not be home alone)
- Once home, rest for 24 hours. After 24 hours, you may begin to mobilise slowly; however do not undertake any form of strenuous exercise
- For pain/discomfort take Paracetamol (but avoid Aspirin or Ibuprofen) and follow the advice on the medication. If the pain continues for longer than 24 hours, please seek medical attention
- Regularly check your groin/arm (puncture site) where you had the procedure. Some bruising at the site may occur and this is quite normal. If swelling or bleeding occurs, apply immediate pressure directly to the area for 5 to 10 minutes, then send for an ambulance. Please take your discharge letter with you
- DO NOT have a bath or shower within 24 hours

- You MUST NOT drive. Your co-ordination and judgement may be affected, and your insurance would be invalidated. Please contact your insurance company for specific stipulations
