Your Radiotherapy Review

Who will I see?

Your consultant will continue to oversee your care; however we have a large team of experienced staff who specialise in the management of radiotherapy side effects. Therefore, your radiotherapy review may be with your consultant or any member of this team.

The review team includes Consultant Radiographers, Advanced Clinical Practitioners, Radiotherapy Review Nurses/ Radiographers and Clinical Nurse Specialists.

All members of this team are highly trained and able to offer you the best possible support and care during your radiotherapy. They are able to prescribe medication where necessary and will work alongside your consultant to ensure you get the best care possible.

Training

We are a teaching hospital, and trainees may be involved in your care. Please be assured that all trainees are supervised and are qualified to see you in your review. There may also be additional people in your review, including students or staff. Please let the staff know if you are uncomfortable having extra people in the room.

Chaperones

Your dignity is very important to us, so we will offer you a chaperone if we need to examine you.

What is a review and what can I expect?

When you receive your radiotherapy appointment list, you will notice that you have one or more Review Clinic appointments.

A review clinic is a meeting with a member of the review team, where your radiotherapy treatment and side effects will be discussed.

You will be given advice and, where necessary, medications to help you manage treatment related problems.

However, radiotherapy reviews can also be requested on any treatment day, through your radiographers, if there is an urgent issue that cannot wait until your planned review.

It is not usually possible to give information on how the radiotherapy is working in the review appointment.
