# Advice following your procedure

The procedure was carried out under local anaesthetic, the effects of which last approximately 2-3 hours.

It is important you follow these instructions for the next 48 hours:

- Have a responsible adult escort you home and supervise you overnight
- Once home, rest for 24 hours. After 24 hours, you may begin to move about slowly BUT do not undertake any form of strenuous exercise
- For pain/discomfort take Paracetamol (but avoid Aspirin or Ibuprofen) and follow the advice on the medication. If the pain continues for longer than 24 hours, please seek medical attention
- Regularly check your neck/groin (puncture site) where you
  had the procedure. Some bruising may occur and this is quite
  normal. If swelling or bleeding occurs, apply immediate

pressure directly to the area for 5 to 10 minutes, and seek urgent medical attention in the form of an ambulance. Please take your discharge letter with you

- DO NOT have a bath or shower within 24 hours
- Avoid heavy lifting and excessive exercising for 2 weeks
- You MUST NOT drive. Your co-ordination and judgement may be affected, and your insurance would be invalidated. Please contact your insurance company for specific stipulations
