The Childrens Community Nursing Team

We are a team of dedicated children's nurses who provide nursing care for children and young people and their families living in the Preston, Chorley & South Ribble area within a community setting. Dependent on your child's condition or illness, we may assess your child/young person at home, clinic, school or a setting closer to home.

We look after children from birth to 16 years of age, unless they have special educational needs or disabilities (SEND), in which case they may potentially stay under our care until 19 years of age.

The nurses will review a child, with a diagnosis, following a referral from health care professionals.

As a parent or carer you should be informed that a referral to us has been made and why.

Our aim is to lower the number of hospital inpatient days required for children and young people and to reduce the number of children and young people admitted to hospital.

How does the service operate?

Our service operates between 8am – 6pm Monday to Friday and does not cover bank holidays.

Student nurses

In order to gain their qualification, all student nurses must undertake training in the community. Therefore, nurses may at times request permission to have a student with them during visits and meetings.
