Upper Gastrointestinal (Upper GI) Macmillan Cancer Support Worker

#### Introduction

The aim of the Macmillan Support Worker service is to give you the skills, knowledge and confidence to manage your lifestyle through advice, support and letting you know about other services you can access.

## Who is the Macmillan Upper Gastro Support Worker?

The Upper GI Support Worker is a healthcare support worker who has had additional training to help support patients and carers living with cancer. The co-ordinator works with your specialist nurse team, who will help co-ordinate your care. You are likely to meet a care co-ordinator at your clinic appointment.

#### What can my Support Worker offer?

The care co-ordinator can offer telephone support or face to face appointments following your clinic consultation with your specialist nurse or consultant.

This may include:

- Undertaking a holistic needs assessment with you. This can help to identify your individual needs and concerns and plan care specifically for you across all aspects of your life.
- Offering support and advice to help you manage your own health needs (supported self- management).

- · Offering simple benefits advice
- The co-ordination of appointments and tests to help you navigate the NHS system
- Offering support and advice at the end of your treatment programme.
- · Signposting to other services
